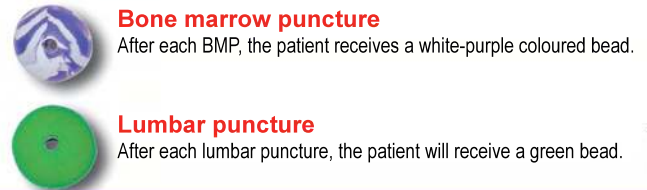
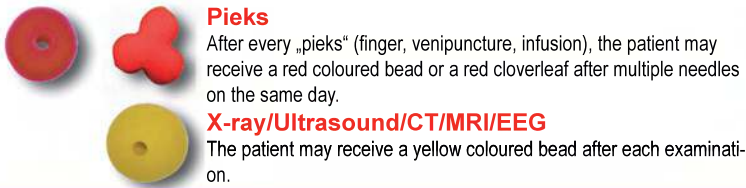


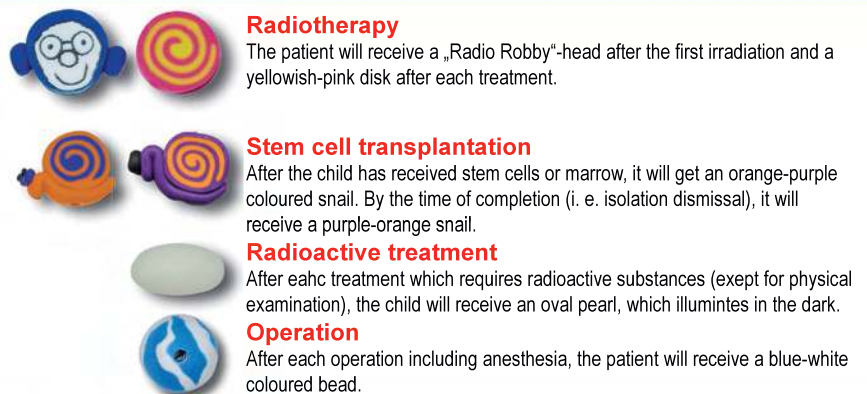
What to do?

Right after the diagnosis the patient receives a long waxed cord, a bead with the logo of the parent's association's, a bead with an anchor (as a symbol of hope), and beads with letters for arranging the patient's name. From this point on, the patient creates a unique and distinct chain. Each bead carries an specific meaning and represents a particular procedure. The beads are handed out by the oncological wards as well as the outpatient department. If a child partially receives treatment in another hospital, it will receive the missing beads after return.

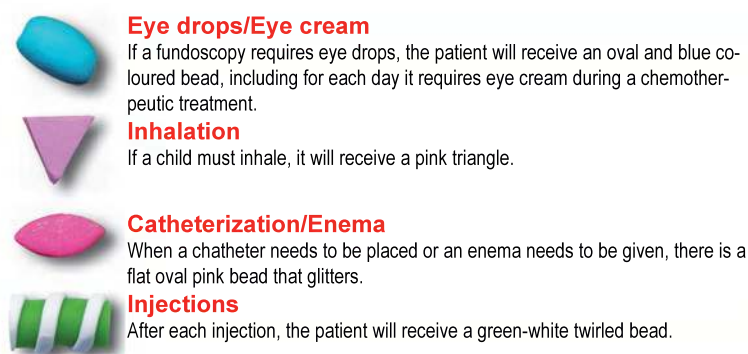
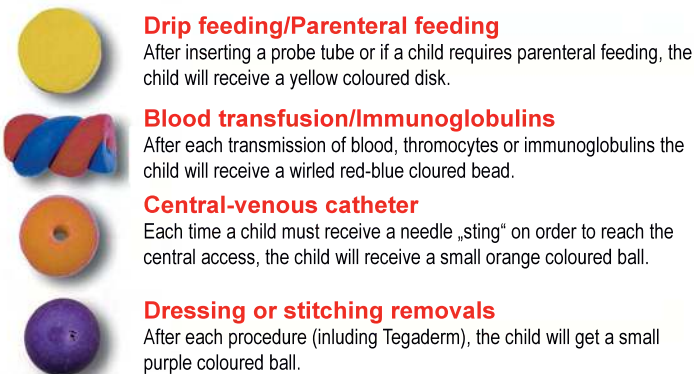
